musical event. I will be presenting an Evening Musical Service called HEGYON LIBI (The Meditations of my Heart) for Cantor, two singers, String Quartet and Organ/Keyboard, written by the renowned Jewish Composer Michael Isaacson in 1977. It was written for what was then the new Gates of Prayer, but works perfectly with our present siddur, Mishkan T'fillah. Even more exciting is that our own Diane Orson will be playing violin along with musicians from the New Haven Symphony and Hartt School of Music. Eric Trudel, our brilliant accompanist and Music Director, will be conducting and playing the keyboard. SOCIAL ACTION NEWS

Jewish Community Alliance for Refugee Resettlement (JCARR)

THE CHILDREN ARE OUR FUTURE A safer, better future for themselves and their children is one dream of refugee and asylum-seeking families. CMI's work with JCARR is making the world a better place, one child at a time. Our hearts fill with hope to see the children doing well.

Carlota loves art and for Black History Month, Carlota's assignment was to make a "soda bottle doll" in the image of an influential African American. Carlota was assigned baseball player, Jackie Robinson and asked Daphne Geismar, a local author, for help. Daphne offered a



variety of supplies: Styrofoam, cardboard, wood, cloth, clay, paper, paint, and a hot glue gun. The two read a biography and Carlota did a Google search for photographs of Robinson and chose one she wanted as her model. The making of the Jackie Robinson doll was all Carlota's work, who spent five hours painting, sewing, and modeling.

Carlota learned a great deal about Jackie Robinson's life. She learned he was a Brooklyn Dodger and the first Black baseball player to play in the major leagues. Fans as well as some teammates who did not want an African American on the team had harassed him. He could not stay in hotels or eat in the same restaurants as the rest of the team.

Carlota had strong feelings about this. While discussing the project with Daphne, she said, "Jackie Robinson got some really bad mail saying that they are going to kill his family because he was one of the



first black men to play baseball. This makes me feel bad.” She went on to add, “I didn’t know until now that Jackie Robinson was friends with Martin Luther King Jr. They

made speeches together [about equal rights for all].”

Carlota shared that she got a perfect score on the assignment! Speaking with Daphne about the project, Carlota said, “I had fun making the Jackie Robinson soda bottle doll. I thought it was going to be really hard, but you [Daphne] helped me with things like sewing and hot gluing. I really liked the sewing.”

Carlota is excited to share her project with you. Great work, Carlota!

C., and Pittsfield and Worcester, Mass. He is Acting Interim Program Specialist for the Central Conference of American Rabbis, where he developed and implements interim rabbinic training and leads best practices seminars for rabbis in interim service. He is the only rabbi on the Board of the Interim Ministry Network and their faculty.
