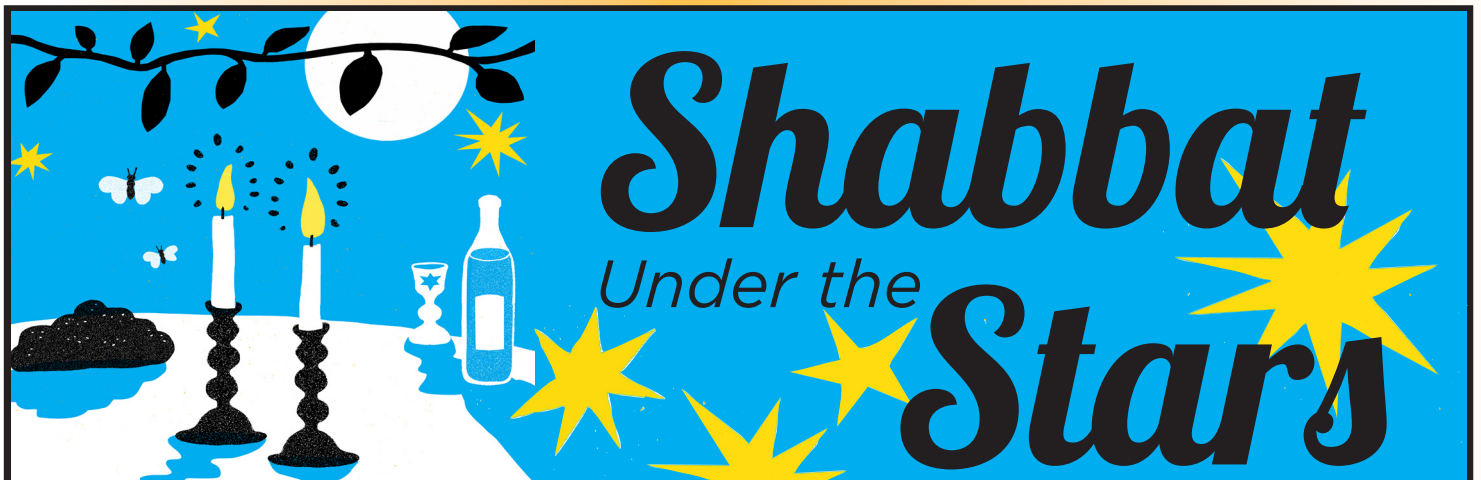

A MESSAGE FROM THE RABBI

How is this still a thing!?! Not COVID, which is still a thing unfortunately, but repentance! We worked really hard at repenting last year, the process in Hebrew called

teshuvah. We apologized to our friends and family, we apologized to the clerk who we wrongfully unloaded upon, and we even paid the long-standing overdue fine at the library. Then we fasted and apologized to God on Yom Kippur, as individuals and as a community. Wasn't it enough? Do we really have to repent again this year?

Teshvuah, including taking stock of what we may have done in the past year, apologizing, making amends, and forgiving. It is not meant to be a burden, rather teshuvah is a gift. The word teshuvah derives from the root 'to turn'; when we repent, we return to the person we want to be, which should be a daily, weekly and monthly process, not just during the High Holy Days. Teshuvah reminds us that we are human and therefore fallible, and that we always have an opportunity to turn toward a different path.

Maimonides, a 12th century rabbi, teaches that one can repent the moment before they die and will still be forgiven in the heavens (Mishneh Torah, Teshuvah 2:1). Often the adage continues that we should repent each day because we don't know what day will be our last. Instead, we might consider the process of teshuvah not out of fear of punishment, but out of the hope of creating a better future for ourselves and those around us. Teshuvah can help us live intentionally with more gratitude, love, hope, pride or whatever values are missing in our lives because we have turned away from them.

Yes, teshuvah will always still be a thing, every day and every year. Leading up to the High Holy Days, embrace the gift of teshuvah by engaging in cheshbon hanfesh, an accounting of the soul. Consider carefully what you want to minimize in the year to come and the good deeds you hope to repeat and expand. May our individual and communal prayers guide us along the paths that enrich our lives with abundant blessings, and may we create a sweet new year for ourselves and others.

Jenny and I wish you a shanah tova u'metukah, a sweet, healthy and happy new year.

Jewish Community Alliance for Refugee Resettlement (JCARR)

JCARR CHILDREN ENJOY SUMMER VACATION

Summer! A magical time. For children in the families that JCARR (Jewish Community Alliance for Refugee Resettlement) has sponsored, summer also has a magical allure. JCARR helped make the magic happen. As newcomers to the community, JCARR families do not always know the resources available to them or their kids; what is out there, how to access it, deciding if this is right for their child, or which programs met their unique needs. JCARR helped our 2 most recent families with the process.

In Family 7, Mom and baby attended ESL and family literacy classes at IRIS and the older children received English skills support and engaged in enrichment activities such as music, art, outdoor play and field trips to Beardsley Zoo and Lighthouse Park.

The children in Family 5 went to their local LEAP summer program. Mornings were spent on literacy, conversation around books and ideas, with a focus on positive social and emotional skills. Afternoons were spent in fun activities such as arts and crafts, sports, field trips to local parks and water parks, science activities, etc. The older girl was very excited about a dance routine she learned; both girls made friends and liked being part of their groups. The New Haven Ballet School offered free ballet classes and these two lucky girls attended 2 afternoons a week in July. They also enjoyed New Hytes Tennis Organization's summer Tennis in the Park program at East Shore Park. When needed, JCARR "friends" provided transportation, and a good time was had by all!

With help from JCARR, the children from two earlier families also enjoyed a summer full of fun. These families are now fully a part of their community, know the programs available, and can navigate the ins and outs of making it work. In JCARR, we call that a success story!

Introduction to Judaism

CMI is excited to once again partner with other congregations to offer a community Introduction to Judaism (ITJ) Class. ITJ will begin on Tuesday evening, October 25. This is a combined course offered under the auspices of the Board of Rabbis and Cantors, with a number of synagogues co-sponsoring. Shanah Tova – Happy New Year! Your Guide to High Holy Days at CMI

We are excited to welcome our community home to celebrate High Holy Days 5783!

On Rosh Hashanah we will hear the shofar sound 100 times, each note part of the *tekiah*, awakening, *shivrim*, weeping, or *teruah*, call to action. These sounds resonate deep within us as we lift our eyes, weep for our fractured world and act to repair it. Of each, the blast we remember most is *t'kiah g'dolah*, the long note that gives us strength, courage and comfort. This long note, the final sound of Yom Kippur, echoes within us until the next Rosh Hashanah. As we enter the final month of our year and the sound finally starts to fade, we begin to rouse ourselves again.

In anticipation of our Days of Awe, during the final month of Elul, we will begin our Shabbat services with the shofar. This tradition reminds us to prepare ourselves for the holy days ahead. We call this process *chesbon hanefesh*, an accounting of the soul. We take note of the good deeds and the not so good deeds from our past year and look at our balance sheet. We do our best to make amends to people we have hurt and we resolve to enter the year with more *chesed*, lovingkindness, than the year before. A process called *teshuvah*, returning to be the best people we can be and *hakarat hatov*, recognizing the good that we have done.

Don't forget about the good! Each of us has fulfilled the commandment to love our neighbor or stranger, and each of us should take time to feel good about the light that we bring to our community.

No matter how you connect with us these High Holy Days, we are grateful for your light, love, and participation in the CMI family.

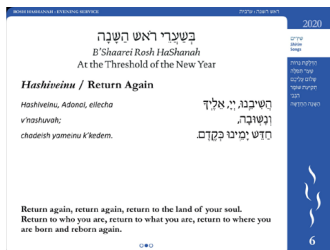
Participate in Person:

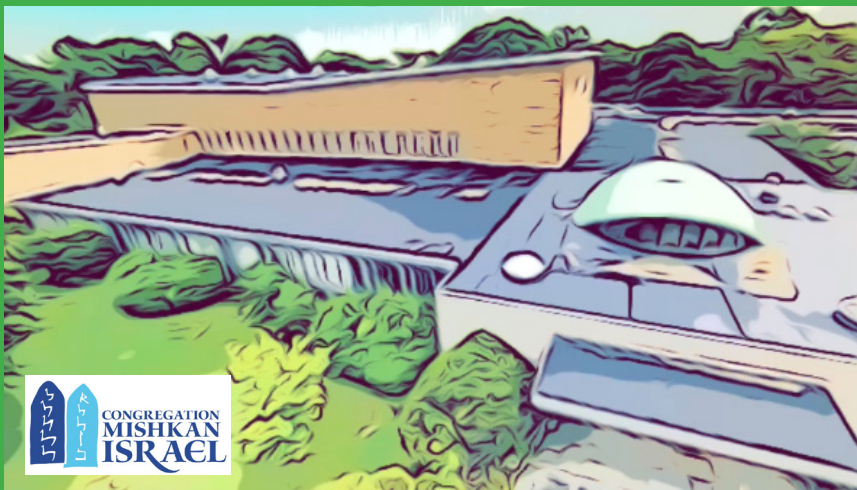
