

# A MESSAGE FROM THE RABBI

Rabbi Brian P. Immerman

In the second week of January, we begin our second book of the Torah, Exodus. While Exodus tells the story of Moses and the departure from Egypt, in Hebrew

we call this book Sh'mot, 'names.' Sh'mot begins with an enumeration of Jacob's family who entered Egypt. Our Torah recalls that "A new king arose over Egypt who did not know Joseph. (Exodus 1:8)" This king is Pharaoh, who enslaves the Israelites and punishes them. Thousands of years later, however, we know how Joseph interpreted Pharaoh's dreams in order to save the Egyptians from starvation. We know that Joseph forgave his brothers and brought them to live as Egyptian royalty. Unlike Pharaoh, we know Joseph and our ancestors because we choose to remember.

Judaism has endured because of our focus on remembrance, the Hebrew word Zachor, as in yizkor. We tell, and re-tell our stories, both ancient and modern. We share the names of those who came before us so that we can build on their legacies, learn from both their successes and mistakes. Our list of names has grown long – our ancient ancestors, the Tanakh, our sages from the Mishneh and Talmud, modern rabbis and scholars, and perhaps most important, our own family and friends. Many we might choose to emulate, while others we intentionally discard. Their names and memories form the foundation upon which we stand today.

Pharaoh, Joseph, Shifra and Puah (the midwives), Moses, Miriam and Aaron all were given the same choice as us – to learn from those who came before and decide how to live in the present, to be guided by fear and malice or to embrace hope and love, even when they were afraid. Even when we are afraid, we can still embrace hope and love. May the names and memories of our ancestors guide us to bring shalom, wholeness and peace into our world as we, like the Israelites, go forth.



# CANTOR'S NOTES

Will global warming bring us palm trees in January and balmy temperatures in February? Who knows? What we do know is that we are having our annual Martin

Luther King Interfaith Service on January 13th. The rise in racial strife and antisemitism has shown that our country and the world have still not learned from past mistakes and we can never be complacent in our pursuit of equality and racial justice. We consciously know that our differences are what will unite us and bring us together, but it is apparent that it will always be a struggle for years to come. Social Justice in all its forms is what CMI is all about, so please join us on that special evening.

February 6th is Tu Bi'Shvat, the birthday of the trees and is a Talmudic holiday given to us by the sages where we feast on fruits and nuts. It is a minor holiday with major importance. Tu Bi'Shvat reminds us of the fragility of the world and the responsibilities we have to care for it. We also must recognize the importance of being responsible to oneself. We come to services out of the need to nourish our spiritual selves, to acknowledge our frailty and worship as a community. I am there to lead you on another spiritual path to God through music, the inexplicable language that allows us to communicate on many levels. The following is a quote from Dr. Rabbi Abraham Heschel's essay, "The Task Of The Hazzan", and it is even more relevant today than when it was written:

"Wherever there is life, there is silent worship. The world is always on the verge of becoming one in adoration. It is man who is the Cantor of the universe and in whose life the secret of cosmic prayer is disclosed. To sing means to sense and to affirm that the spirit is real and that its glory is present. In singing we perceive what is otherwise beyond perceiving. Song, and particularly liturgical song, is not only an act of expression but also a way of bringing down the spirit from heaven to earth. The numerical value of the letters which constitute the world shirah, or prayer is equal to

the numerical value of the word tefillah, or prayer. Prayer is song. Sing to Him, chant to Him, meditate about all the wonders (1 Chronicles 16:9) about the mystery that surrounds us. The wonder defies all descriptions; the mystery surpasses the limits of expression. The only language that seems to be compatible with the wonder and mystery of being is the language of music. Music is more than just expressiveness. It is rather a reaching out toward a realm that lies beyond the reach of verbal propositions. Verbal expression is in danger of being taken literally and of serving as a substitute for insight. Words become slogans, slogans become idols. But music is a refutation of human finality. Music is an antidote to higher idolatry. While other forces in society combine to dull our mind, music endows us with moments in which the sense of the ineffable becomes alive."

We are bombarded daily by the other forces of society that are dulling our minds and we are surrounded by "higher idolatry", so come to CMI on Shabbat to join in the musical conversation that will give you solace and peace in otherwise troubling times. Kick it up a notch. Join me for a duet, play in the Oy Street Band, hear the sweet voices of the Jr. Choir, help me bring back the CMI Chorale or just plain sing to yourself. You will always be part of the conversation!

As JCARR celebrated its seventh anniversary in December, we reflect on its growth and spotlight the contributions of Jean Silk.




