A MESSAGE FROM THE RABBI

Most seder plates look the same with the ingredients specified in the Haggadah. For many Ashkenazi Jews, those of Eastern European descent, our interpretations of these items

descends from the ingredients available to us now and to our parents, grandparents, and many generations before. The same is true for Sefardic Jews, those with roots in Northern Africa and the Middle East. Yet aside from different charoset recipes, the Seder plates still do not often diverge. Some time ago, a man commented about female rabbis, quipping that "a woman on the bima is like an orange on the Seder plate." In response, Reform Jews began adding an orange to the plate.

Over time, people have offered many other ingredients in order to signify the struggles of marginalized groups - women, LGBTQ, trans, people of color, and more. In 2019, Chef Michael Twitty offered a very different interpretation of bitter herbs and the other items on the Seder plate with his "African American Seder Plate for Passover," which you can find on his blog, Afroculinaria. He suggests that people of African American heritage could replace many of the "traditional" foods with those that represented the story of Black American oppression. Regardless of what ingredients we choose for our Seder plates, these foods are supposed to remind us about the core themes of Passover - the bitterness of bondage and the promise of redemption.

God commands us to both remember that God freed the Israelite people and to see ourselves in the story as well. "And you should explain to your child on that day, 'It is because of what God did for me when I went free from Egypt.' (Exodus 13:8)" We recite this line in the Seder to remind ourselves that we have experienced redemption, perhaps ongoing for most of us, from the narrow places in which we find ourselves. For some of us, these might be more figurative than literal, and we pray that we all find freedom through our own efforts and the help of friends and family. We also accept the obligation to help others along the way, people we know and strangers who need our help. We can find the connections to our past and to others through food. *Continued on page 4...*

Jewish Community Alliance for Refugee Resettlement (JCARR)

Religious School Students Support JCARR L'dor V'dor—From generation to generation. Recently, our hearts were lifted by youth-led activities at Congregation Mishkan Israel, which made significant, meaningful contributions to JCARR's refugee resettlement work.



At CMI, Eli Rudikoff and Pierson Canavan represented JCARR at CMI's Mitzvah Mall. These longtime friends were excited to work together. Eli helped his mother with her JCARR volunteer activities as a younger child and shared what he already knew with Pierson. The boys educated themselves about JCARR'S mission and created a trifold poster board highlighting JCARR's work.

They answered questions such as "What is a refugee?" and both were articulate and tailored their responses to each student's level. The boys also offered JCARR's "Welcome the Stranger" greeting cards available for purchase.

Additionally, their presentation resulted in the 2020 B'nai Mitzvah class choosing JCARR as one of three organizations to receive money that the 2020 B'nai mitzvah parents pooled for a charitable

donation. Due to COVID, the selection process was delayed and after the 2020 B'nai mitzvah students listened to student representatives of various organizations, they voted for JCAAR and 2 other organizations to receive a donation.



MARTIN LUTHER KING JR. WEEKEND EVENTS RECAP



MLK Interfaith Service

CMI held its annual Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Interfaith Service on Friday January 13. A diverse group of faith leaders (pictured) joined Rabbi Immerman, Cantor Giglio and the CMI Chorale with soloist Mandi Jackson and pianist John Letteri, to honor Dr. King. For the first time



since the beginning of the pandemic, 200 people attended in person, with another 200 on livestream.

The guest speaker was Dr. Deitra Reiser (at Rabbi Brockman's left in the photo), an educational psychologist and founder of Transform for Equity, an antiracist repair group that supports organizations and leaders in building capacity for diversity, racial equity and belonging. Her sermon, Co-conspiring for Liberation, focused on the imperative that we work to build cross-race relationships while accepting that it is often uncomfortable. A Black Jew, Deitra plays a key role in the Union of Reform Judaism's initiatives to promote diversity, racial equity and belonging in the wider Jewish community.

Torah Study

On Shabbat morning, Deitra co-led Torah Study with Rabbi Immerman. After Rabbi shared his d'var torah, she facilitated a discussion about Jews and white identity. When questions arose about whether Jews are white, she offered the term "White eligible."



Deitra divided the group into pairs for more focused conversations. Each pair noted comfortable, satisfying aspects of life at CMI, and were asked to identify one thing that would improve the CMI community. The ensuing full group discussion was lively, with adults, youth and children all making thoughtful contributions.




