- <u>Matilda Makes Matzah Balls</u> by Rhonda Cohen. (Call number-E HOL PASS COHE)

 Matilda adds unusual ingredients when she helps Bubbe make matzah balls. (Ages 3-8)
- Raquela's Seder by Joel Edward Stein. (Call number-E HOL PASS STEI)

 During the Spanish Inquisition when Jews were not allowed to practice their religion,

 Raquela's father finds a way to have a seder. (Sydney Taylor Notable book for ages 5-10)
- <u>A Persian Passover</u> by Etan Basseri. (Call number-E HOL PASS BASS) Ezra and Roza explore sights and smells of a seder in Iran in the 1950s. (Ages 5-10)
- <u>Max and Emma cross the Red Sea</u> by Carl Harris Shuman. (Call number-I F SHUM)

 Max and Emma go back in time to see if the Red Sea really parted for the Israelites.

 (Ages 6-10)
- Why on This Night? A Passover Haggadah for Family Celebration by Rahel Musleah. (Call Number I 262.5 Mu)

The rich traditions of Passover come alive in this contemporary Haggadah which takes children beyond the Four Questions and encourages them to enjoy every step of the seder. (Ages 12 and up)
